The time has come to turn our vision into reality. This is a very exciting time for North Park Central Neighborhood residents and you are a key part of the project. This project will not happen without residents' commitment, input and cooperation. We are the primary stakeholders for this project and it is essential that we define what the Wall will resemble. Because it affects residents along 7th Ave the most, it is extremely important for you to attend.

The vision is to bring back a world famous artist and extremely successful Phoenix College Alumnus, Eric Fischel to head up this project. Back in April of 2006 board members, Phoenix College leaders, and City leaders met with Mr. Fischel to present the idea to him. To our delight, he supported the idea. We sat quietly like children mesmerized as he took our concept and began to unfold a story.

We know a few things about the project already. One is we need a new wall to support the art work and we will be working with the City for that portion. Second is the material that goes on the wall has to outlast our summer heat. Ceramic tiles and perhaps glass tiles is the material that can do the job.

What we will be doing at this focus meeting is begin to develop a theme. This could be a time, place or event that is important to each of us. Something that invokes thought and has a deep meaning to each of us. Some of the topics so far are Water in Phoenix, Roots, Agriculture, The City, Copper, and Music. We will divide into groups where a board member and Phoenix College Art Faculty member will lead discussions to begin to develop a theme.

This project which involves the unique and visually appealing transformation of the Wall from its current state opens up many opportunities. It will be a point of pride as one of the City's newest public art displays and destination points. It provides many educational opportunities to art students and local artists. It bridges the gap between Melrose art area and Phoenix College. It also provides practical experience for digital media and journalism students because the project itself will be a documentary in the making.

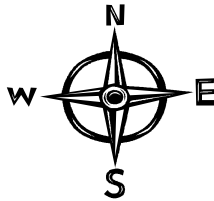
